On August 13, 2006, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Indianapolis dedicated its first House of Abraham. Sponsors included: Church Federation of Greater Indianapolis, Second Presbyterian Church, Nur Allah Islamic Center, Indianapolis Center for Congregation, University of Indianapolis, Martin College, Martin University and Butler University.

Its Mission Statement: The House of Abraham is a cooperative Habitat project, enlisting members of the Christian, Jewish, and Muslim communities of Indianapolis. These diverse communities seek to come together as one community in order to assist a family who is striving to own their first home. Participants of this project value the tenets of mutual respect for one another, acceptance of difference, and right to each other's respective beliefs. These values are absolute.

On behalf of Habitat for Humanity, Second Presbyterian Church invites your mission's pastor or pastor to an informational meeting on November 15th, at 10:00 a.m. At this meeting you will learn how you can participate in advancing the mission of the House of Abraham in 2007. We have set a goal of building two houses totally financed by the faith communities in 2007. We hope to build the first Habitat home in Israel with an interfaith community organized by the students of Mar Elias University in the year of 2008.

This is a tremendous opportunity to build interfaith relationships in Indiana which will have global influence as we build relationships in Israel.
